ARRA HOME

On February 17th, 2009 President Obama signed the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) or Stimulus Package to restart the economy. The package contains extensive funding for science, engineering research and infrastructure, and more limited funding for education, social sciences and the arts.

The University of Washington responded by setting up several ARRA project teams and work groups to coordinate a technical reporting solution and broad ranging communication. Representation is provided by management sponsors, central offices and campus. See [organizational chart](#).

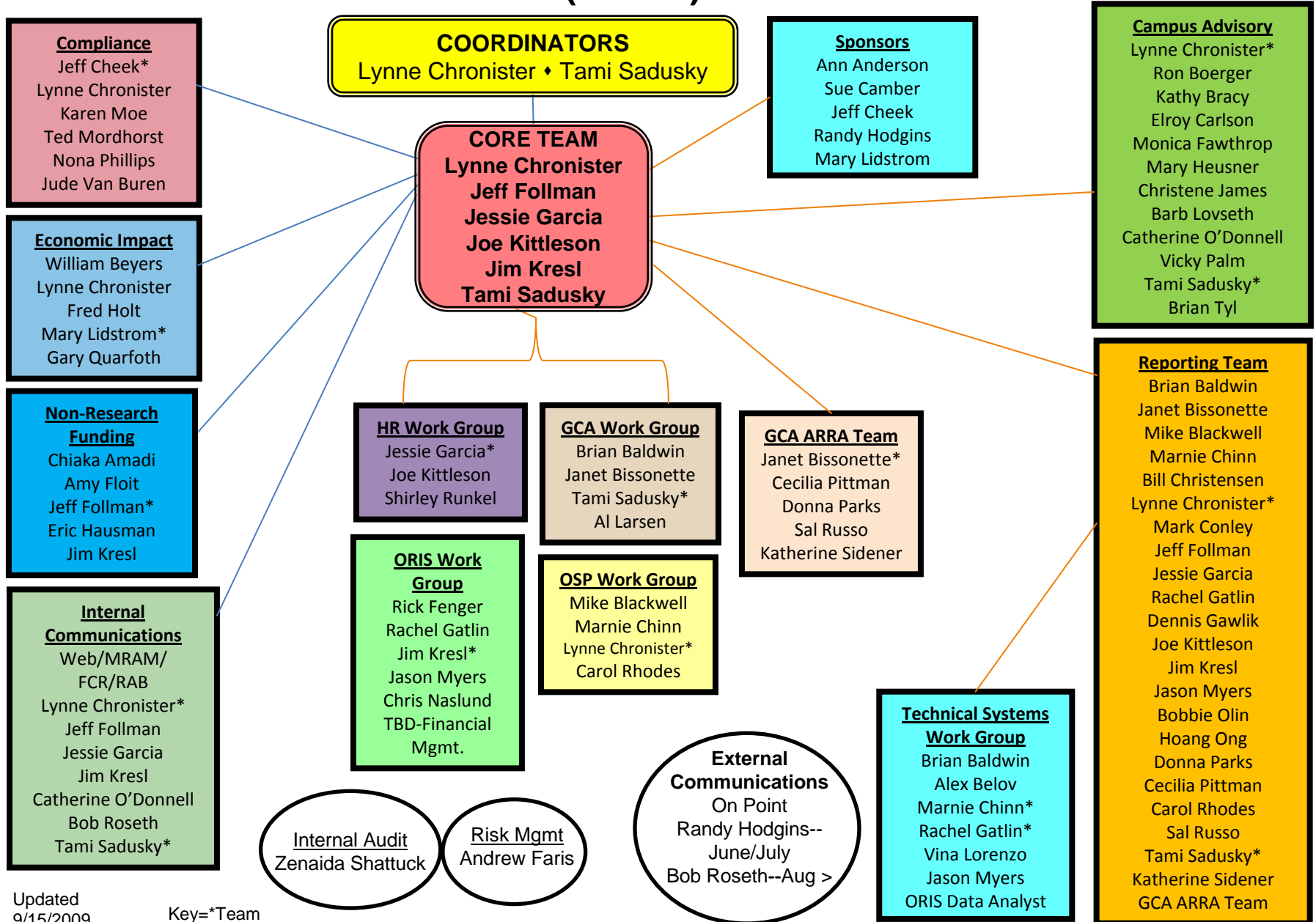
The UW's Response

In March 2009, the UW started organizing its response to the Recovery Act requirements. Campus wide groups were established to provide oversight, leadership and support to assess and meet the ARRA Federal requirements.

ARRA Teams Regularly Meet to

- Identify reporting and funds management requirements
- Develop a Data Mart for collecting data required for the quarterly reporting
- Collaborate with UW central offices
- Communicate with campus, federal and state agencies
- Monitor awards received and project/program expenditures

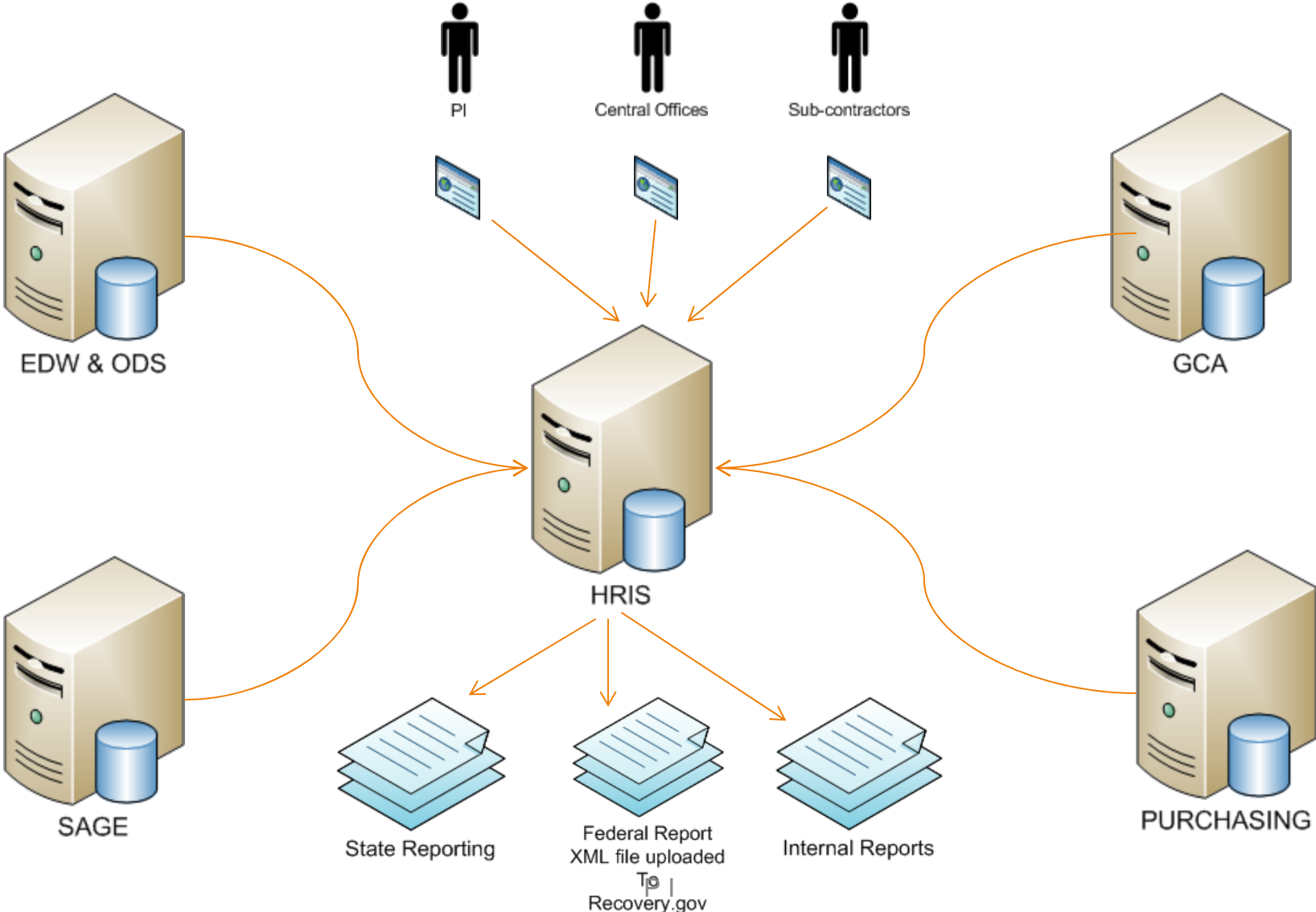

Principal Investigator's Responsibilities

ARRA Compliance Expectations

- Funds should be spent in a timely fashion and reported quarterly
- Cannot “supplant” existing funds with ARRA funds
- Compliance with sponsor and UW policies and procedures
- Cost transfers between ARRA and non-ARRA funds will be monitored closely to ensure compliance with ARRA regulations

ARRA Funds are Monitored in the 20-xxxx Budget Series

- Contact Team ARRA at uw-arra@uw.edu if your ARRA budget is in a different series

ARRA Reporting Requirements are in Addition to Current Sponsor Reporting Requirements

Additional Reporting is Required for Sub-recipients and Vendors, Unless Clearly Delegated by Prime Recipient

- Coordinate with department administrator and OSP regarding sub-recipient reportable items

Principal Investigator's Responsibilities (cont'd)

The PI Must Report on Two Data Elements Each Quarter

- The percentage of project completion
- Description of quarterly activities / milestones
 - Grants: description of the overall purpose and expected outcomes for the award and for first-tier sub-awards
 - Contracts: description of significant services performed and/or supplies delivered

The UW will Consolidate all Data Elements from the Data Mart and Other University Sources and Submit Report

- There are 99 data elements that need to be

Sub-Awards

UW as a Sub-Recipient*

- Prime** will decide who reports and what needs to be reported

UW Issues a Sub-Award

- UW will do the federal reporting
- Sub-recipient must send reporting elements to UW five days prior to the 10th of the reporting month
- Two missed reporting periods and UW may terminate sub-award
- Extensive reporting elements for sub-awardees
- Must “quick start” sub-awards
- Sub-awardees will be given a UW Net ID to enter non-scientific report
- Be sure “milestones” are correlated with prime report
- Scientific / Technical Project Report must be submitted by UW PI
- UW PI will be notified if a sub-awardee report is late

* Sub-recipient = Federal funding flows through another institution

** Prime = Recipient of federal funding

HR Support

- Reporting of Jobs
 - Run from payroll data
 - % distribution on 20-xxxx budgets
 - Report in FTE to federal government and will be cumulative
 - Distinguish retained and new for internal purposes
- Accelerated Hiring Process
 - Review in compensation
 - Use of candidate banks for new hires
